
Sitting in sessions with individuals is a unique privilege and responsibility. It's a privilege to hear stories of lives filled with pain from trauma. This trauma can come from betrayal of innocence and trust, physical and/or verbal mistreatment of self or others, emotional or spiritual abuse. I have the responsibility to pray for and with the individuals I listen to. Another responsibility is to keep confidentiality.

In hearing others' stories, I've learned we can be blinded to who we are. The Bible clearly shows us who we are in Jesus Christ. We are loved, accepted and precious daughters of the King of Kings.

Pain can lock our hearts to receive or give love. When one can realize Jesus cares about the pain and is willing to take it, her heart can begin to open.

Agreements with the Enemy can also be made when our life is full of pain. Lies are believed. Having those lies exposed and agreements broken can be hard work. It's exciting to see the Holy Spirit reveal truth from God's Word and set individuals free. A reminder to me when negative thoughts come is the question, "Whose voice am I listening to?"

My heart is often touched and grieved by what I hear. It's hard to fathom the normality of sin that an innocent child can experience which takes her innocence. It's difficult for that adult to understand the awfulness of the sin committed against her. My understanding of living in a fallen world has taken on a new depth. Frequently my anger is stirred that this happens in our circles and few seem to be aware or care. I'm thankful to be a prayer partner with Dave and the ladies I sit with. My praying begins before I arrive for the session. Dave starts and ends the session with prayer. Often, we pray during the session. The Holy Spirit is the One who gives wisdom, discernment and direction throughout the session. He is the Revealer of truth and the Comforter. 
